

We Rage, We Weep Alzheimer Foundation

Funding Criteria:

1. Diagnosis must be made by a practicing; certified physician that the person affected has "Alzheimer Disease," "probable Alzheimer Disease," "dementia of the Alzheimer's type" or related dementias. The physician's statement requires one of the above diagnoses for the person to be eligible.
2. Financial grants are provided for expenses related specifically to the care of the person affected by Alzheimer Disease or related dementias living within their own or their caregiver's private residence. Funds may be provided for any necessary service or supply not currently available through statutory funding that compliments existing community programs. Assistance will always be provided by or through qualified service providers.
3. Eligible persons may receive grant assistance depending on need and availability of funds.
4. Applications are funded based on established need as determined by a point score system and on a first-come, first-served basis. Priority treatment will be given to those already being assisted by the We Rage, We Weep Alzheimer Foundation. New applicants are placed on a waiting list and are considered as funding becomes available. The extent to which assistance can be provided, as well as the number of persons who can be helped, is determined by the availability of funds. At times, it may be necessary to place an approved request on a waiting list until funds become available.
5. Liquid assets (which include cash, chequing and savings accounts, money market accounts, stocks, bonds, and mutual funds) of the person affected by Alzheimer Disease and their caregiver** will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the Board of Directors. Liquid assets do not include either person's vehicle or primary residence. However, all of the person's assets will be taken into consideration in determining the urgency of need via the Foundation's point score system.
6. Applications must include a net worth statement (assets and liabilities), a copy of the previous year's tax return (income), 3 months of bank statements (cash flow), a monthly budget (income and expenses) and proof of any funding received from statutory sources by way of a means test. Applications require an original signature and a corroborating statement from the physician, health professional or social worker of the person affected by Alzheimer Disease before they are presented to the Board for funding consideration. The Board of Directors may also request a power of attorney or other proof of the primary caregiver and/or money manager.
7. Applicants who have been denied funding may re-apply after receiving a denial letter if financial status or circumstances change, however; they are encouraged to explore alternative sources for additional help.
